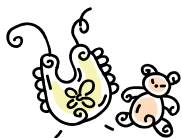
Cleveland Hall Website

We would like to recognize Dianne Davanport as the new ARC Chair person and thank John Davis for his service as chair for the past few years and also for remaining on the committee.



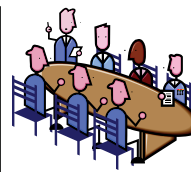

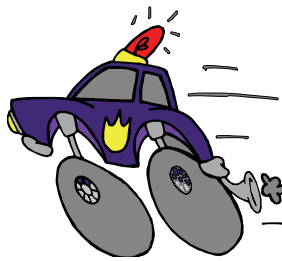

Neighborhood Safety:

There are still concerns about speeding in the neighborhood. Please be mindful of children at play, walkers in the area, and the posted speed limit. The hermitage Precinct has agreed to step up enforcement in the area. Also remember that unauthorized use of streets and sidewalks is prohibited, i.e., motorized scooters, go-carts, lawn mowers, etc.

Dark and Dusk

Rising temperatures and increasing hours of daylight bring with them a corresponding increase in traffic accidents involving children and cars. The periods of greatest risk are the hours just before and after sunset. During periods of twilight, visibility is limited and a driver's depth perception is reduced by low light levels.

- All evening play clothes (especially jackets, coats, and wind breakers) should have reflective cloth strips. So should bikes, helmets, and backpacks.
- Evening strolls should include a flashlight — especially if all or most of the walking is alongside roads and streets without sidewalks.
- Bike riding should be specifically prohibited, unless the bike has been equipped with reflectors, head lamps, and other night-riding safety features.

Playing in the Street

City streets are not playgrounds, and we don't advise that kids use them as such. However, if you do allow your kids to play in the street or on lightly traveled roads, please follow a few commonsense safety tips.

- Stop all play when a vehicle is spotted; move to the side of the road and resume play only after the vehicle has passed.
- Use inexpensive traffic cones marked "Play Area Ahead" to advise drivers that kids may be in the road ahead. Cones should be placed on the center line, so as not to block traffic a few hundred feet away from the play area. Remove cones when kids are finished playing or bike riding.



Play Ground Safety: (It's That Time of Year Again)

Playgrounds and outdoor play equipment provide fun, fresh air, and exercise. You can make the playground a place that's entertaining and safe for your kids by checking equipment for potential hazards and following some simple safety guidelines. Teaching kids how to play safely is important: If they know the rules of the playground, they're less likely to get hurt. If you find unsafe conditions in the Cleve-

land Hall play area, please report it immediately to Kathy Holbrook at 615-269-7016 ext 204..

Parents can help prevent playground accidents by taking some precautions, ensuring that there's adult supervision at the playground, and making sure that the equipment is appropriate to a child's age and maturity level. Adult supervision can help prevent injuries by making sure kids properly use playground equipment and don't engage in unsafe behavior around it. If an injury does occur, an adult can assist the child and administer any needed first aid right away.

Kids should always have adult supervision on the playground. Young children (and sometimes older ones) can't always gauge distances properly and aren't capable of foreseeing dangerous situations by themselves. Older kids like to test their limits on the playground, so it's important for an adult to be there to keep them in check.
